

Detached house in its own grounds. Accommodates a maximum of 10 persons.

GROUND FLOOR: entrance hall, dining-room, drawing-room with working fireplace, study, kitchen (with dishwasher), pantry room, double bedroom and shower room.



FIRST FLOOR: 2 double bedrooms, 2 single bedrooms, 1 twin bedroom, 1 bathroom, separate lavatory and washing machine.

The residence features a characteristic tower with a sitting-room.

Garden with garage and informal living-room with fireplace and barbecue.

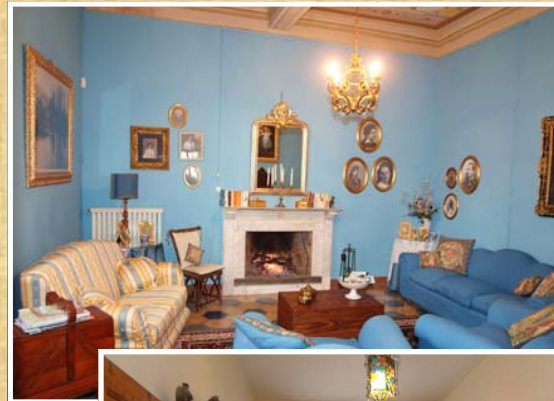
VILLA MARCELLA in Cavriglia was built in the 19th century as the summer residence of an aristocratic family.

It was originally called "Fattoria Monastero" as its vineyards, which produced excellent Chianti wines, stretched as far as the Cavriglia Monastery.

The house has the elegance and charm of the period and some of the rooms still retain the original frescos. It is pleasantly furnished with country style furniture of the period.

There is also a small collection of photographs taken by Marquis Giovanni Gargioli who was an engineer and an inventor.

He built one of the first cameras in Italy and in 1892



he was appointed director of the National Photographic Institute in Rome. A man of many interests, he was a friend of Guglielmo Marconi, the writer Carlo Lorenzini (alias Collodi, the author of Pinocchio), the composer Giacomo Puccini and the poet Giosuè Carducci. These famous people were occasionally guests at the house.

Villa Marcella lies in an ideal position either for visiting Florence, Siena and Arezzo or spending your day meandering around the hills and vineyards of Chianti, Italy's famous wine region.
